Financials

Message from the KGHOA Treasurer



This article on our finances may be helpful to Kings Gate residents.

The subject this month is the Income Statement.

The Kings Gate community receives monthly financial statements from Castle Accounting. The Balance Sheet was discussed last month. The second and perhaps the most important report is the Income Statement.

The Income Statement is a record of all income and expenses for the month reported. Secondly, it shows how that income and expense compares to the amount budgeted for the month. Year to date totals and budgets are also provided.

The income, or Revenues on the statement, are primarily the receipt of monthly assessments. Also included are smaller sources such as the storage lot and ballroom rental. Actual amounts are shown for the report month and for the year to date. And each amount is compared to the corresponding budget period. Variances indicate that amount below or above budget for that line.

Similarly, expenses are detailed and reported with their budget variances. Expenses include everything from the monthly Benderson fee, to cable, electric bills, repairs, insurance and the contribution to Reserves.

Reviewing the Income Statement helps to identify trends, unusual expenses and possible errors or omissions. Just being below budget is not always good. For example, a budgeted expense line such as Benderson fees or insurance may be low only because we have not yet made the payment.

The role of the treasurer and resident advisors is to review this statement in detail a few days after the month closes. Every line is reviewed and then investigated in more detail as warranted. The goal is to verify that what is recorded is what you expected to see.

Resolution of questions sometimes means obtaining additional information from Castle. But almost always, the answers are in the detailed ledger reports that are also received each month.

The Balance Sheet discussed last month is used closely with the Income Statement. For example, the Balance Sheet may indicate that "we have plenty of cash on hand." That surplus could just be the result of some expenses that were not recorded in the month.

Castle provides extensive monthly reports. The treasurer, the finance advisors, and often the HOA President meet each month to review and verify the reports. And annually Cole Accounting audits the finances of KGHOA.

So how are we doing this year?

Through fiscal September:

YTD Revenues are	\$3,123,154	That is \$28,603 over
budget.		

YTD Expenses are \$3,163,017 That is \$68,466 over budget.

Remember in our recent budget meetings that actual Insurance and Property Taxes far exceeded the 2024 budget. And these YTD numbers are not yet verified. The actual expenses reported are temporarily low due to an open issue with the Property Tax charges.

Doug and Rowena have

been in Kings Gate for five years. Trivia was a well established event long before we came. When we arrived, it was still being sponsored by the Lions Den with most of the prizes and advertising provided by the Den. It also included dinner and full bar.

At some point, the hosting was transferred to the HOA. Since that transfer, sponsor support for prizes and advertising has waned. It remains a very popular event, but has recently received little advertising in the newsletter. Never-the-less it is well attended with a loyal following. Even during the summer with only fulltime residents here and little advertising, we've had at least five tables--typically, at least 10 per table. During the "season," we typically have about 130+ participants-we just let everyone know when it's going to be held, and it will be well attended. Currently it continues to be scheduled for the second Monday of each month.

Topics include a variety of subject areas: Current events, history, geography, sports, entertainment, music, famous people, and other venues are likely to pop up.

Trivia will be held on 2nd Monday (Dec. 9th) in the ball room.

Cost: \$10/per person.

Tickets should be purchased in advance and will be available in the office.

This team event has a maximum of 12 people per table. Prizes are awarded to the team with the most correct answers in each of the three rounds of questions. (There's always a tie-breaker question). But, it's really about the bragging rights.

Bocce



This version is played on a sand court approximately 60 feet long and 12 feet wide, with wood sides. We have two here at Kings Gate. They are located between the pool and Tennis/Pickelball Courts. One end has a scoreboard for each court. There is both league and individual play available at the courts. It is a first come, first serve availability, but, league play takes

priority. Balls are available in the bocce locker on the side of the main building and a building key will unlock it.

We ask those who use the courts to use the special brooms hanging on the side next to the pool after you finish playing. We suggest you brush the courts before you start: the ball rolls more true. NO LIFTING THE BALL INTO THE AIR!!!

League play requires two teams of preferably four players, two players/team on each end of the court. The idea is the team that gets their ball closest to the pallino (small white ball) and gets a point for each ball that is closer to the pallino than a ball of the other team. The first team to get ten points win. A copy of the rules are available upon request.

League play takes place three times per year; Fall League starts at the end of September. Winter league starts the first of January and the Spring league starts the first of April. (The Fall league ended September 21. The Winter league with a January start date is available for sign up now.)



1. The deadline for submission is the 10th of the month for the following month's publication - for example for a December publication we need any articles in by November 10.


2. Articles need to be submitted in a Microsoft Word doc which usually has an extension of .doc or .docx.

Those who have heard Kristi will say she has a gift for teaching with her one hour video lessons which seem like 20 minutes. The student book is available through Amazon or LifeWay.



This cranberry salad is a fabulous blend of fresh cranberries, walnuts, orange, crushed pineapple, and gelatin.



Kings Gate Resident Volunteer Spotlight



This month's volunteer spotlight is on **Peggy** and **Mike Ludgate** who have been residents in Kings Gate for the past 2 ½ years after moving from North Port. Peggy and Mike volunteer at Meals on Wheels in Charlotte County every Thursday and also fill in as need-

ed. They have been doing this for many years, first in North Port and now in Charlotte County. Peggy drives along with her dog "Tiny" while Mike delivers the meals.

Meals on Wheels of Charlotte County is a nonprofit organization which has been serving Charlotte County since 1969. Their main office, kitchen and thrift store, which raises revenue in support of funding meals, are all located at 3082 Tamiami Trail in Port Charlotte. They serve approximately 150 meals Monday through Friday that are cooked, packaged and delivered to seniors in the county.

There are many volunteer jobs available: drivers, kitchen help, thrift shop or helping with special events. Peggy says, "Many people say they are bored; look around, there are lots of volunteer opportunities in the county."

Peggy volunteers as an advocate in local nursing homes and assisted living facilities and also does presentations as a community educator with the Alzheimers Association. If you remember, she recently did a presentation in Kings Gate. Thank you Peggy & Mike for your contribution to our Port Charlotte community.

Volunteers love wildlife and nature

Imagine arriving to volunteer at a place nestled in the mangroves, where every morning you become transported by a symphony: barred owls hooting, bald eagles screeching, a sandhill crane trumpeting, screech owls trilling, and a pileated woodpecker drilling like an over-caffeinated carpenter. These are just some of the morning greeters at the center!

Now imagine working amongst these wonderful birds, tortoises, small mammals, and raptors, each with a distinct personality, much like our own pets at home. Peace River Wildlife Center (PRWC) is only seven miles away from us and is a unique place for those of you who love nature.

My name is **Holly Dodds** and I moved from St. Louis, Missouri, in August of 2021. I discovered Ponce de Leon Park/PRWC via **Bill Johnston**, one of our Kings Gate residents, in 2022. I applied to volunteer at this animal rehab center the next day. For the past two+ years, I am rejuvenated and energized each week as I spend time volunteering at the center.

What do we do at PRWC? The wildlife center in the park provides care for rescued animals that can no longer be released into the wild. Our residents often become ambassadors to the public, used for teaching and to help raise funds to support their care. Fortunately, most of our rescues recover at our affiliate hospital and get released back into the wild.

In 2022, I began as a weekend cleaner. When I retired in March, I added an additional morning each week to prepare the residents' food, then feed my feathered friends. (If any of you have corn hole skills, tossing fish head-first to pelicans is a good fit for you!) I have helped at Sunset Happy hours, picked up donations from local stores, as well as numerous other activities with other volunteers.

PRWC has many needs for volunteers including: working the gift shop, answering phones, feeding wildlife babies that are too small for the hospital, cleaning, food preparation and feeding (mornings or afternoons), and/or training



to handle the various animal ambassadors to help educate the public. If any of you have a love for nature, I encourage you to seek out this lovely effort to help our Florida wildlife.

A few years ago homes were staying on market for a matter of days. Those times have changed and with more inventory on the market – it is taking longer for homes to find a buyer. Pricing is about 10% to 15% off peak pricing – but it seems to be holding stable now. Also, several homes that were financed were short term or bridge loans where people were going to pay off their loan as soon as they sold their other house.

In our marketing/advertising searching for Kings Gate buyers, we have shifted emphasis a bit due to the recent storms. Where we used to lead with all the activities available in Kings Gate, we now lead with these facts: Kings Gate is more than 20 feet above sea level, has never experienced a storm surge, is not in a flood zone and is in evacuation zone D (which has never been under evacuation order). Those facts are equally important to buyers up North considering a Florida home and to local Florida buyers looking to move away from a canal, evacuation zone A, or a manufactured home community. We have had several local Florida buyers seeking higher/ safer ground – and Kings Gate is well positioned to capture those buyers.
