Spring is here. We have been blessed with beautiful weather after a cool winter. There have been many activities within Kings Gate and in the surrounding area to keep everyone busy.

The board has been acclimated to seven members which is a challenge but is working. Several new committees have been formed. These include Communication, Documents, Elections, Finance, Legal, Pool, Roads, and Strategic Planning. In addition, an Ad Hoc Comcast/Internet Committee will be working on exploring various options prior to our Xfinity contract being up for renewal in 2026.

The road on Westgate is finally being repaired on April 16th, completing the project on May 16 and May 17th. This project has had numerous delays due to rescheduling and coordination with the golf course. The road will be closed on those days.

The pool has been working well. Remember to ask your guests to follow the rules: rinse off prior to entering the pool and leave the umbrellas tied down when leaving the pool area. New matting has been added in the back entrance hallway and in the bathrooms to prevent slippage. Our residents' and their guest's safety is a priority.

The Envera gates are working well again. The gates only allow one car at a time through the gate, so be patient. Guests and contractors must go through the visitor's gate. Enter your guests on the My Envera application with the dates and time expected.

Speeding within the community continues to be a problem. The speed limit is 18 mph, so please slow down and watch for cars backing out, children, bicycles, and golf carts, and stop at all stop signs. Golf carts must follow the same rules of the road. Golfers must stop prior to crossing all roads. No one can drive a golf cart unless they have a driver's license, as it is against the law. Safety is a major concern for everyone. Only golfers are allowed on the golf course paths. No dog walking, walkers or golf cart lookers are allowed. Now that it stays lighter in the evening expect golfers to be on the course later. (See related story on rules of the road.)

Many winter residents will be leaving soon. Please secure your home; no hoses, pots, or yard ornaments should be left outside. Make certain someone is keeping an eye on your home and yard. The flower beds must be kept trimmed while you are away. Let the office know how to reach you and who is checking on your house.

Roundabout Rules of the Road

Here are some basic rules and guidelines when driving on the roundabout. Although everyone is supposed to go <u>to the right</u>, many golf cart drivers cut across and go left. This is very dangerous because people familiar with roundabouts are used to just looking to the left. Please obey the signs that have an arrow that shows you to go right <u>only</u>. There are also yield signs at all entrances. That means you wait for cars and carts already in the circle before entering. There have been a number of near misses, mainly from cars entering from Rampart without paying attention to other traffic.

The circle drive to the clubhouse follows the same rules. Enter from the right, continue counterclockwise. Many golf carts have gone to the left to go to the Pro Shop. Cars can't always see them till it's almost too late because of bushes and not expecting anyone from that direction.

Everyone, please show consideration for your neighbors/fellow drivers.

Message from the KGHOA Treasurer

This article on our finances may be helpful to Kings Gate residents. A brief status report for the month

For the month ending 1/31/25 report, our cash position remained steady. From \$637K the prior month end to \$636K. This is as of the closing date of the month and often varies with the timing of receipts and expenditures.

January was a quiet month financially. No extraordinary or unexpected expenses.

Both Working Capital and Reserves grew with no expenses in the month.

The lifestyle fund portion of our cash was \$51,531. Some of those funds are committed to upcoming events.

As we begin 2025 our new budget is in place. The budget includes monthly contributions to our Working Capital and Reserves.

Cash balance and other metrics alone are not the complete picture. Each month, and almost every day, the treasurer, the Board, Castle, and the finance advisors work to be sure that our finances are "in order."

This month's spotlight is on **Charlie McClure.**

Charlie and his wife **Barbara** have lived in Kings Gate for seven years. They are both very active in the community.

> Charlie is retired from the U.S Navy where he served as Chief Petty Officer performing in such areas as: radar, navigation, communications, air intercept

controller, anti-surface, anti-air, anti-submarine, and intelligence.

He did two tours of instructor duty and managed to sail on five different ships.

Charlie got involved in the Honor Flight first as a veteran, then joined the staff. He's been active with the group for three years as a Veteran Coordinator.

If you're interested in joining the group, volunteer at any of their events. They meet once a month on the fourth Wednesday of the month at 7:00 pm in the Palace Theatre. April's meeting is the 23rd.

The Honor Flight selects veterans to go to Washington, DC for the day. The selection is on a priority basis as follows: World War II, Korean War, women who serve, Vietnam War, then all others who have served in any capacity or time frame are chosen.

So far 84 veterans from Kings Gate have been on a flight over the past several years.

While in Washington, DC, the veterans are taken by bus to visit the World War II Memorial, Korean War Memorial, Vietnam Wall, Women's Memorial, Iwo Jima, Lincoln Memorial, Tomb of the Unknown Soldier, Air Force Memorial, and possibly the Pentagon and the Capitol Hill buildings (depending on time constraints).

The cost of each flight is approximately \$120,000, which includes the flight, all meals, bus, snacks and escorts. Kings Gate has helped to raise money for the flights through the selling of 50/50 tickets in some of our events. The Honor Flight group also holds various fundraisers throughout the year.

We thank Charlie for all his hard work on this great endeavor. We can all help by supporting the events that are sponsored by the Honor Flight.

Pack lightly (back pack or fanny pack) for excursions, but take necessary items such as small amounts of cash and/or a secure credit card, sunscreen, waterproof camera, sanitary hand wipes, etc. It is recommended to not take your actual passport on excursions unless told otherwise. Stay vigilant and aware of your surroundings.

Choose small-group excursions depending on the excursion: For example, diving should be limited to no more than ten divers at a time.

Know if there are state department warnings where you intend to travel such as the warning to "exercise increased caution for the Dominican Republic due to crime." You may want to email the local tourism office where you intend to visit and ask for information.

Finally, make certain your passport is not due to expire within six months of travel.

Following these few tips can help ensure you have a safe and enjoyable vacation. Travel insurance is always encouraged.





For Your Health

Lifestyle Choices and Living Conditions May Affect Aging More Than Genes



It's an age-old question: Does nature or nurture impact us more? When it comes to our health, it may be the latter. A <u>new study</u>

suggests that **lifestyle and living conditions affect aging** significantly more than genetics.

Researchers with the University of Oxford examined data from **nearly half a million biobank participants**, assessing the influence of 164 environmental measures and genetic risk scores for 22 major diseases. The team also used a novel aging measure, or "aging clock," that looks at blood proteins to evaluate the speed at which people age.

They found that **environmental factors accounted for 17% of the variation in risk of death**, with smoking, socioeconomic status, physical activity, and living conditions impacting mortality and biological aging the most. Genetic predisposition, on the other hand, explained less than 2% of that risk. And of the 25 associated environmental factors the study identified, <u>23 are modifiable</u>.

"Our exposome approach allowed us to quantify the relative contributions of the environment and genetics to aging, providing <u>the most comprehen-</u> <u>sive overview to date</u> of the environmental and lifestyle factors driving aging and premature death," lead author Austin Argentieri said in a statement. "These findings underscore the **potential benefits of focusing interventions on our environments, socioeconomic contexts, and behaviors** for the prevention of many age-related diseases and premature death."

Prioritizing health is about more than just avoiding illness; it's a holistic approach encompassing physical, mental, and social well-being. We are

Why Donating Blood Frequently May Reduce Your Risk of Cancer

good selfish reason to do it, too.

A new study from researchers at the Francis Crick Institute in London determined that giving blood often may result in genetic changes in our blood stem cells that help prevent cancers like leukemia from developing. When comparing frequent donors (individuals who gave blood three times annually over 40 years) to sporadic ones (those who gave blood fewer than 10 times total), the scientists found that the former were more likely to have favorable genetic mutations in their stem cells.

"Our work is a fascinating example of how our genes interact with the environment and as we age," senior author Dominique Bonnet said in a statement. "Activities that put low levels of stress on blood cell production allow our blood stem cells to renew and we think this favors mutations that further promote stem cell growth rather than disease."
